Good morning Linda,

Let me first introduce Debra Varnak who is vice president of the Unity Foundation of LaPorte County. In addition, Debra is also a new member of the Rotary Board. The Board has been discussing the exhausted funding for the eyeglass program for the remainder of this Rotary year which ends 6/30/2018. Debra has identified an individual who is willing to provide a one time gift in order to purchase glasses for needy students in order to bridge the gap for the remaining four months of the Rotary year.

As all of us are aware, the Board has authorized up to twenty students for the 7/1/17 to 6/30/18 Rotary Year. The original budget provided for only ten students, but that number was reached so quickly the Board added an additional ten students. The last request that I authorized was just after the first of this year. That authorization was number twenty; therefore, you and I have had no further discussion regarding this program. My first question is in relation to how you and your nurses have been providing service to students in need of help for the current semester? My second question relates to your best projection of the number of students who might desperately need help over the next four months?

Furthermore, the Board will be in need of some sort of an estimate for the demand for the 2018-2019 Rotary Year in order not to be caught off guard as has been the case this year. That is not to say that the Club will have unlimited resources to devote to this program, but maybe there will not be the shock to the budget as has been the case this year. Better planning will hopefully, allow everyone involved to be on the same page. I must admit that I did not expect to see the demand for services more than double this year in relation to the prior three years. In fact, I am a little paranoid as I wonder what I am doing wrong since I took over the program after Dale's death.

The February board meeting has been moved to early March due to the short month and a conflict in Marty's schedule. I would expect next year's budget to be formulated in April or May for presentation no later than the June board meeting?

Please respond to both Debra and myself. I will forward everything to Marty since his email tends to jam the mailing when there are several people involved.
